





Distribution and Sampling Group

- The questionnaire* was sent to:
 - Discourse
 - MARVEL mailing list (with an additional reminder)
 - Emails of past participants in AiiDA tutorials **
- It was roughly available for about one month May to June.
- We've collected 38*** responses, of which only 17 (~46%) responses recorded from MARVEL.
- Considering sampling group and reachability of users, presumably we have more external users than those
 associated with MARVEL, although they may not have been immediate to publish their work.⁺⁺
- * Most of questions were not obligatory to answer, to avoid compulsive responses.
- ** Note: many of these emails never delivered, because many of these users students/postdocs who were not affiliated anymore with their previous institution, still some retrieved manually.
- *** Only one person from PSI (we didn't fill ourselves)
- ++ We explicitly asked if you want to highlight your publication in our website, and only got a few responses. Meaning many of our external users, haven't reached to publication point, yet.




Usage


 More than 80% of responsive users are currently using AiiDA for research.

- Among those who were participating in AiiDA tutorial, there is an **increasing** number of those got hooked on, and using it since the last three tutorials.
- About 60% of responsive users have been utilizing AiiDA for only less than two years. Which means their results might not have been ready to publish, yet.


For how long have you been utilizing AiiDA in your research work? 31 responses



Are you currently using AiiDA for your research? 38 responses




Can you recall the year you took part in an AiiDA tutorial?





Learning Curve: users who dropped out

 Those who participated in AiiDA tutorials, but never used it afterwards mainly said:
 "I was stuck in learning process"



- We asked "Please be more specific about the your answer above." Some were referring to not having enough computer resources, or have being totally new in this field of research. Apparently lack of a clear research idea, also played a rule.
- We asked again "what aspect of AiiDA did you find most difficult to grasp", and many pointed to difficulty of setting up workflows.



Learning Curve: users who stayed put

Among those active users, 58% have never participated in an AiiDA tutorials. We asked how did you learn, they equally weighted the **knowledge of their research group** and **online documentations**.

We asked three main question: what they found difficult to understand in AiiDA in the past and now, and what can we improve.

- * Among answers we came across a self learner from <u>Colorado said</u>: "The documentation is pretty fantastic and I think researchers can pretty easily self-teach. [...]"
- * A person from <u>Germany</u> said: "[It's difficult] **To know when to apply which concept (calcfunctions, -jobs, workflow chains, ...) to my specific use case. But the docs are great, I have to simply read it again and let all those concepts sink in to my brain."**
- * A person <u>Canada</u> who is using AiiDA for less than a year, didn't know how: "Fixing and resubmitting jobs that did not exit successfully"
- * Somebody from <u>Netherlands</u> found it challenging: "If I want to do something that's not inherently supported by either AiiDA core or one of the plugins, but I would like to do it from within AiiDA to preserve provenance."

Some others found it difficult:

- "to get use to database structure rather than folder based"
- "lack of "unsafe" no-provenance mode for quick-and-dirty use cases"
- the simple add & multiply example in tutorial useless, and not practical in real use case.
- "querying data is not straight forward and difficult"
- "to set up a first workflow"

What's next? Action plan summary

The following tracks that we are already implementing seem to be in the right direction:

- WorkGraph [final stages of development] → providing easier logic than workflow
- aiida-shell* [developed] → able to run custom scripts
- verdi presto [developed] → quick setup
- verdi dump [developed] → downloading data as local folder

In addition, based on the feedback, we plan to start the following actions:

verdi git/mirror [in discussion] → folder based behaviour

^{*} Increasing number of users: the most frequently mentioned plugin is aiida-quantumespresso with 15 mentions, followed by aiida-vasp with 5 mentions, and aiida-shell and aiida-pseudo each with 4 mentions, in the responses.
